

Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command (JPAC)

JPAC is the operational component of DPMO. JPAC's mission is to achieve the fullest possible accounting of all Americans missing as a result of our nation's past conflicts. Their day-to-day operations involve investigating leads and recovering and identifying Americans who were killed in action but were never brought home.

The command is located in Honolulu, Hawaii. It is made up of approximately 400 handpicked Military members, government civilians, and contractors. The laboratory portion of JPAC, referred to as the Central Identification Laboratory (CIL), is the largest forensic anthropology laboratory in the world.
